The degree of loudness or softness in a musical composition.

MUSICAL FORM

The structure of a piece of music.

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Sonata Form (ABA)
Strophic Form (AB)
Rondo Form (ABACA...)
Canon
Fugue
Madrigal
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The quality of a sound governed by the rate of vibrations producing it

Pitch can be attributed as being "high" or "low" when comparing two or more pieces of music

MELODY


A succession of single tones of varying pitch.

A tune or musical theme.

An organized sequence of tones played in succession to make up a phrase or idea

MELODIC CONTOUR

The shape of the melody, which usually rises and falls.



ARTICULATION

The style in which a song's notes are played.

Articulation effects are written with articulation marks, which modify the execution of notes and create relationships between them.
